Leaves: Finely cut, fernlike, bipinnately compound, with tiny lance shaped leaflets.

Flowers: Lavender-blue 8" clusters of tubular 2" flowers. Late spring, summer.

Fruit: Brown pods, round and flat, 1 to 2", in fall

Disease(s): Resists oak root fungus.

Special Points: Damaged by heavy frosts. Needs protected site or urban heat island.
