**Special Identifying Features**

**Leaves:** Simple, alternate, palmately 3-lobed, smooth edged, glossy, 3" long

**Bark/Twig:** Flexible, twining

**Flowers:** Showy, 2" to 3", pink, lavender, white, blue, depending on species and cultivar. Some fragrant.

**Fruit:** Round, 1½" to 3" wide, in summer and fall, green, yellow, or purple when ripe, edible kind is *P. edulis*

**Pest(s):** Scale

**Special Points:**

Vigorous vines. Some evergreen and some deciduous. Likely to tangle. To keep plant open and prevent buildup. Prune annually after second year, cutting excess branches back to base or juncture with another branch.
